



FARM BOOTS by Lisl Detlefsen

- 98 percent of U.S. farms are family farms.
- The oldest known depiction of boots is in a cave painting from Spain, which has been dated between 12,000 and 15,000 B.C.E.
- Farmers work 365 days a year, there is ALWAYS something to do!
- March, on average, is the wettest month in Georgia
