Fun Facts:

- Georgia has led the nation in the number of broilers produced for decades.
- Broilers are the number 1 commodity in Georgia. Eggs are the number 3 commodity in Georgia.
- Georgia is the top provider of certified organic chickens in the U.S., with sales topping \$33 million. But when it comes to eggs, Georgia hens lay almost \$773 million worth a year!
- About two-thirds of Georgia's 159 counties produce at leave \$1 million in poultry each year and account for nearly 138,000 local jobs.
- Three out of four Georgia counties are involved in poultry and egg production.
- In 1995 the Georgia state general assembly declared Gainesville to be "Poultry Capital of the World."
- The incubation period for children eggs is 20-21 days.
- In 2020 Georgia produced 31 million pounds of chicken, 7.6 million table eggs and 6.3 million hatching eggs in one day!
