- According to Unity Environmental University, urban farming is “the practice of cultivating crops, livestock, or types of food in an urban environment.”
- Urban agriculture encompasses a wide range of areas including urban farming and food production, nursery and greenhouse production, sustainable turfgrass and landscape management, and urban forestry. Urban agriculture provides fresh, local food to communities and numerous environmental and social benefits as well as beautification.
- Urban agriculture offers multiple benefits, including: improved food security, enhanced nutrition, increased physical activity, community building, and environmental stewardship and conservation.
- Urban agriculture addresses challenges within urban communities including noise abatement, soil erosion and runoff, and preservation of wildlife habitats. It can also provide economic opportunities through production and distribution.
- Some of the top vegetables grown in Georgia include Vidalia onions, sweet corn, tomatoes, squash and leafy greens. Georgia vegetable producers benefit from the state's favorable climate and innovative farming techniques, such as precision agriculture and sustainable practices.
